平 亥 革 命 一 百 周 年


中國同盟會

今年是辛亥革命一百周年,因此撰文一篇,細説同盟會於 辛亥革命之重要性。

1905年8月20日,「中國同盟會」於日本東京都由湖南華興會、廣東興中會、江浙光復會合組成立,政綱為「驅除韃虜,恢復中華,創立民國,平均地權。」以孫文為首黃興為輔,展開了針對清政府的革命。

之後黃興受孫中山先生指示從日本回到中國,回到中國廣 西後化名張守正,進行地下反清活動。1907年中國同盟會大起

義,余丑起義於潮州黃岡,歷六日而敗。鄧子瑜起義於惠州七女湖。黃興指揮了欽、防二州起義,孫文同時和胡漢民由法屬安南河內率同盟會員及法國僱傭軍支援起義軍。同盟會員兼廣西起義軍黃明堂攻下鎮南關後等待孫文到來指揮。孫文到達後清軍開始反攻,孫文

因此回河內請求法軍援助,但革命軍堅守7日後被迫棄守 鎮南關退入山中,孫文得知後發覺為時已晚。於是與黃明 堂起義軍合兵,北上攻打雲南省河口市,途中黃興從兩廣 率起義軍趕至,三軍合力攻打河口,但河口起義終因清軍 回防而告失敗。

1910年6月中國同盟會再度發動起義,由同盟會會員倪映典指揮廣州新軍起義,但被清廷迅速鎮壓。1910年1月18日,中國同盟會於香港屯門青山紅樓舉行歷史上最後一次於香港的會議,決議進行黃花崗起義。

1911年4月27日,黃花崗起義失敗,參與巷戰的起 義軍除黃興外全部陣亡,黃興右手斷了無名指和尾指兩 指。由女友徐宗漢護送至香港休養,後來黃興更娶了徐宗 漢為妻。

1911年8月7日,中國同盟會會員譚人鳳勸共進會及湖北新軍於武昌起事,而兩廣則大部分歸於起義軍治下。

1911年10月10日,武昌起義成功,震驚中外,辛亥 革命成功爆發。中國同盟會推舉孫文就任中華民國第一任 臨時大總統。1912年1月1日元旦,孫文就任中華民國第 一任臨時大總統,中華民國建立,定辛亥革命爆發日為 國慶日。

在孫文擔任中華民國總統後,中國同盟會事務便交由主要幹部黃興及宋教仁處理。中華民國平定中國南方地域,但清內閣總理大臣袁世凱拒不承認民國政府,派兵鎮壓民國政府,民國政府大敗,雙方議和。最後訂立密約由袁世凱迫使清朝皇帝退位,而孫文則遵守密約讓袁世凱擔任總統。孫文淡出政壇後於上海開設中國鐵路總公司,黃興亦淡出政壇前往上海法租界成為作家。

唐紹儀和宋教仁則在孫文和黃興淡出政壇後接手中國同盟會,1912年8月25日,宋教仁以中國同盟會為核心,聯合國民公黨、國民共進會、共和實進派等黨派,合組成中國國民黨,召開成立大會。成立唐紹儀內閣壓制袁世凱,宋教仁當選為理事,被孫中山委任為代理理事長。此時,宋教仁主持北京國民黨本部。次年3月國會議員選舉,國民黨獲得多數席位。宋教仁更造民間輿論壓制袁世凱。1913年3月14日宋教仁就任國民黨黨魁,中國同盟會由政治團體過渡至政黨完成其歷史使命。

香港歷史博物館 辛亥革命百年展觀後感

辛亥革命是中國近代史上的重大改革時刻,辛亥革命結束了自秦以來兩千多年的帝王 統治,揭開了中國歷史的新一頁,給中國帶來 了共和政體,推翻了君主獨裁。除了政治翻天

覆地的改變,其他方面也出現重大的變革,其中白話文的地位得以確立,中國人民接觸更多西方文化,望向世界。


在辛亥革命中,不少志士為創立共和體制而獻出了生命。著名的黃花崗七十二烈士跟隨黃興參與廣州起義,體現了「國家興亡,匹夫有責」的精神,也是清廷首次有高級官員被革命軍所殺,雖然廣州 起義最終失敗,但黃花崗七十二烈士的愛國情操仍然為後來的眾多反 清人士所景仰。

香港也是辛亥革命的發源地之一,以孫文為首的四大寇在香港開始了反清事業,直到孫文創立同盟會,香港一直都是革命黨人反清的主要據點,陳少白和尤列在香港宣傳中國革命,輔仁文社東主謝續泰亦在本港創立輔仁社,聲言:「列強侵我中華,唯滿奴喪邦賣民,著實可鄙!欺人太甚,凡大漢之民,俱不應忘薙髮留辮之恥,揚州十日,嘉定三屠見盡滿奴之殘暴。除滿奴人人有責,拿起武器!站起來!反抗滿奴的壓迫!」

香港是辛亥革命的發源地,革命思想在此發展至成熟,今次辛亥革命百年展難得在本港展出,實在意味深長,值得一看。

近日,有不少神奇的「立體粉筆畫」在內地網站廣泛流傳。幾經筆者追 查,發現原來是河南安陽,一位名叫侯政峰的裝修工人所為。

他表示,於08年有網友上傳了一些街頭粉筆畫,不少網友驚呼這些作品「不可思議」。而他為了打破這種盲目的崇拜,不久之後在一個廣場上畫了一個立體長方形。



而去年於上海靜安區梅龍鎮廣場亦有一幅以2010上海世博會為題的粉筆 畫亮相,還引起了相當的轟動。其實,立體粉筆畫一點都不難畫。其原理就是 「透視原理」,因此只要在特定的位置和角度觀看作品,就會得到最佳的視覺 效果。

街頭的立體粉筆畫,其實早於16-17世紀就出現,更是德、意的傳統藝術之一。後來逐漸被人淡忘,直至1973年,一間教堂請來街頭藝術家為教堂創作粉筆畫,才令這一種藝術流行起來。



在此亦介紹一位頗為著名的英國藝術家-Julian Beever。他以繪畫壁畫及複製大師作品為主業,街頭立體粉筆畫只是副業。但他卻經常游走於英、法、德、美等國家創作立體粉筆畫,用粉筆為當地的街頭添上一道新穎獨特的風景,因此聲名遠播。



而中國網民最為熱棒的應該是Julian Beever於哥本哈根所創作的粉筆畫。在網上搜查得來的粉筆畫圖片,差不多全都是出自他的筆下。

除了Julian Beever這樣出色的藝術家外,國內亦有不少新晉的街頭藝術家。 例如,將立體粉筆畫帶入中國的齊興華。連本港的蘋果日報、文匯報亦曾以太 古廣場的《香港-城市大爆炸》為題訪問他。



2009年,北京奧運村內的《古龍今韻》入選第十一屆全國美術展覽,標誌著立體粉筆畫在中國內地被主流藝術所接納。而齊興華亦不忘創新,他於去年(2010年)為西安秦始皇兵馬俑博物館,繪畫了一幅「牆」「地」一體的立體畫一《戰馬歸來》。

這一連串的組圖,就是Julian Beever於哥本哈根創作立體粉筆畫的過程。

但不少街頭藝術家所顧慮的是,在現實生活中,由於內地城市管理方面 的限制,並不能隨意繪畫立體畫。於北京,更沒有能供人直接在地上繪畫的地 方。雖然粉筆畫難以保存,具有觀賞上的時間性,但想要清理的時候也很難, 不過立體粉筆畫始終是一種具有價值的街頭藝術。

一味線

三味線是日本的一種弦樂器。

一般認為起源於中國的三弦,大約成形於15世紀左 右。中國的傳統樂器三弦經過琉球王國(現在的沖繩), 產生了早期琉球群島的「三線」,之後傳到日本本土,逐 漸成形。

其構造基本分為「天神」(纏弦的部分),「琴 桿」和「琴身」三部分。

琴桿採用木材製成。為了便於攜帶,一般都是由 三截拼接而成的,分別稱為「上桿」、「中桿」、「下 桿」。而不能分成三截的琴桿稱「長桿」。由於琴桿是光 滑的,因此在入門時培養左手對把位(稱為「勘所」)的 感覺很重要。

琴身為四方形,正反面蒙上貓皮或狗皮。在三味線 表面可以看見左右對稱的黑點,這實際上是貓腹部的乳頭 的痕迹。由於貓皮高價難求,故也使用狗的背部的皮製 作,但狗皮三味線表面的黑點是故意畫上去的,成為一種 裝飾、傳統。

琴弦一般採用絲弦,也有用尼龍材料的。數量為三



根,從粗到細依次稱為「第一弦」、「第二弦」、「第三 弦」。

演奏時需要撥子。撥子成銀杏葉形,具體的大小形 狀根據流派、音樂和演奏者的習慣不盡相同。

三味線樂聲清脆有力,適合演奏激烈情感的音樂, 多支三味線合奏出的樂章更是無比澎湃。即使吉他等熱門 樂器相比,亦毫不遜色,甚至有過之而無不及。

三味線多用於演奏傳統日本民間音樂及演歌。

日本幕未維新志士高杉晉作率領13人火燒正在江戶 品川禦殿山施工的英國公使館後,以三味線伴奏唱出了大 和民族的精神。

可見三味線的重要性和傳統性。

隨著時代的變遷,亦有一些新民樂主義者(如:吉 田兄弟),創作一些具現代特色的音樂。甚至有一些演奏 者使用它來奏出西方音樂,有日本遊戲公司亦於製作原聲 音樂集時,讓三味線擔當伴奏甚至「主角」(Capcom旗下 的作品:大神)。可見三味線的演奏者於保留其傳統特色 之餘,亦不忘開拓新市場及作新嘗試。

舊生訪問—— 劉振平老師

小學及中學生活

何: 你是由聖貞德小學升上聖貞德中學的嗎?

劉:對呀。我是由聖貞德小學升上來的。

何:那你可否講述一下你在小學的生活?有甚麽深刻的 印像?

劉:那時小學和中學都是在同一座大樓,最低的三、四層是小學,上面就是中學。校舍不是很大,但印象最深刻是校舍有很多樓梯,很多木製裝飾,枱、櫈都是用木造。特別是當時年紀小,看到甚麼都覺得很巨型。後來小學就搬到了北角清風街,聖猶達堂那邊。而中學就於86年搬到寶馬山。位於羅便臣道的時候,我記得小學生不可以走到中學部那邊,中學生也不可以走到小學那邊。

何: 學校如何防止你們走去中學部呢?

劉:因為一進學校就是一樓,一樓以上是中學部;以下就是小學部。而且還有兩道門隔著,所以小學生和中學生也不可進入對方的校舍。再加上小學部規模不是很大,只有兩班,全校總共也只有12班。反而中學部規模就大得多,我記得當時的中一有六班。

何:是否分作信、望、愛、義、智、勇六班?

劉:中一、中二、中三是這樣,中四、五、六、七就分作Arts One、Arts Two、Arts Three; Science One、Science Two,我們簡稱A1、A2、S1、S2。Arts是文科,Science是理科。是後來才改成信、望、愛、義、智、勇。

何: 你可否講述一下在羅便臣道的聖貞德生活?

劉:因為當時的活動空間不多,與現在寶馬山校舍比較差太遠了,校舍出面有一個可以泊到幾輛車的操場,頂樓是有蓋天台。天台有一個很小的圖書館,大概比現在的一個班房大一點。當然也有小食部、洗手間。小食部便是同學食午餐、上體育堂的地方。有時候,還會在那兒踢波。其實那裡的環境並不適合踢波,因為那裡有柱,而且地上有很多類似導盲磚那樣的突起物,而且更為細小,所以你永遠不知道球會彈到那裏去。在小食部排隊需要很長時間,買到食物後很快就「打鐘」。那時沒有甚麼活動空間,來來去去也是那幾層。



何:但不是有特別室用嗎?例如實驗室?

劉:也有特別室,和現在差不多。上體育堂就是在天台走來走去,但是沒有音樂室。那時最辛苦是甚呢?學校附近沒有甚麼好吃,要去到堅道那兒才有好吃的地方,我多數回家吃午飯。另外,那時的午飯後鐘聲很有趣,是用哨子代替鐘聲。由首席學長負責吹哨子,打鐘前五分鐘就咇一聲,然後又再有一聲。哨子聲十分響亮,整條羅便臣道都聽得到。我們吃完飯要走五、六層樓梯上天台,走到上去已經大汗淋漓,那裡又不透風,往往上到天台已是一身汗臭。當時天台是我們最重要的活動場所,聽校長、神父訓話都是在天台。雖然有禮堂,但是禮堂是小學部使用的,中學部沒有禮堂。那個年代的物質條件較差,有些學校甚至是建在天台上。

何:有沒有甚麼老師影響你較深呢?

劉: 我記得中四的班主任和中文老師,那時的老師跟現在不同,態度較嚴肅。我們上課時亦不敢多問問題,落堂後看到老師亦會害怕。當時中四的班主任剛從中文大學畢業,第一年出來教書。教學手法新穎、亦比較平易近人。他教我中文及中國歷史科,放學亦會與學生「傾計」。我中三升中四那年的成績不太好,而他就教我讀書的方法,鼓勵我向多方面發展,我的成績亦有改善。

何: 你在學校擔任過甚麼職務?

劉:我有做過學會幹事。最特別是中六時曾參與籌辦步行籌款,另外我有參加中文學會,那時會出自己的會刊。以前的會刊全部都是手繪和手寫的。除了封面外,其他都是黑白印刷。內容會有小說、書介、影評、漫畫。另外一本我曾經參與的會刊就是美術學會會刊,我亦有寫文章,我還記得那篇文章是關於「宇宙戰艦大和號」的,我評論松本零士所畫的漫畫的背後意義和思想,譬如與日本軍國主義有何關係,亦有試過寫一些東西交去美術學會。但未試過投稿到報社。

黃:馮Sir講過,他在Last Day時也曾做過一些頑皮事。 你有沒有呢?

劉:中五Last Day沒有甚麼特別,中七時也只是跟老師拍照。當時並非每個家庭可以購買相機,相機是奢侈的玩意,但剛巧我家買了一部相機,所以我便負責帶相機回校跟老師拍照留念,在Last Day沒有發生甚麼特別「曳」的事。

個人興趣

何: 你喜歡甚麼科目?

劉:我喜歡地理科、中史科、經濟及公共事務科,到後期亦有一段時間喜歡中國文學。

何: 為甚麼你會對上述幾科有那麽濃厚的興趣?

劉:當時沒有很多科目可以選擇。中史科方面就喜歡歷史人物,了解每一件事的來龍去脈,小時候已經喜歡看歷史故事。另外,我亦覺得地理科很有趣,例如地殼變動之類,但那時我較喜歡人文地理,就是講城市化、人口發展等。中國文學是到中六、中七才開始喜歡,我特別喜愛宋詞,亦喜讀世界歷史,總之與歷史有關的我都喜愛,都是我的興趣所在。

何: 所以你就想到畢業以後在這個專業發展?

劉:沒有這樣長遠打算過。當時的選擇不多,社會亦很 簡單。現在供你們選擇的科目很多,亦很複雜。最 近我還看到甚麼「核子風險管理」的科目···連 聽都未聽過。以往就只有文科和理科之分,十分簡 單。

黃: 你的年代,是否男孩子就一定要讀理科?

劉:不是這樣的。我畢業後理科才開始流行。而且聖 貞德有段時間是沒有理科的預科班,只有文科預 科班。我之後的年代才開始有理科班。馮Sir低我一 屆,他是第一屆的理科預科生。而我的理科成績較 差,根本想都不用想,一定是入文科。沒有甚麼觀 念拘束我,全部都是我自己選擇。

何:為何你會修讀「國際關係」這一科?

劉:為了興趣。

何: 那你不是應該去做記者、或與外交有關的工作嗎?

劉:其實我還有讀「戰略研究」,當時很多同學都是外國軍官、外交官員。像我這樣的一介平民就比較少,我純粹為興趣而讀。

入行的經過

何: 你是怎樣入行的呢?

劉:其實我都是在畢業後看求職廣告,然後找工作。和 每一個大學畢業生一樣。 何: 那為何你會回來聖貞德教書?

劉:其實教書不過是我當時其中一種想找的工作,我更加不知道當時我看的求職廣告是聖貞德刊登的,因為當時的廣告是沒有寫明校名的。當我看到有學校聘請GPA老師,便想嘗試一下。最後校務處打電話通知我面試才知道是聖貞德。

何:但你寄出求職信時信封上不是要寫地址嗎?

劉:當時是用郵政信箱地址的,所以我不知道是聖貞德。我的年代的求職廣告通常都不會登出校名,現在的廣告就多數會有校名。那時只會寫上北角區、某校、諸如此類。

何: 你教GPA是否因為你中學時這一科最高分?

劉:哦!我在中學階段沒有學習過GPA這一科的。我讀書的年代,其實還沒有這一學科,GPA是我畢業後才開始設立的。我大學時修讀「社會科學」,亦有一段時間修讀「國際政治」。這些科目與GPA有一點關係,內容亦有些相似,所以我便教GPA。

何: 起初你教授甚麼科目呢?

劉:初期我教過英文, GPA [即政府與公共事務科]。 主要教中四、中六及中七。慢慢就轉教通識與 I.H. [會考綜合人文科],現在就唯一教高中通識。

感想

何:你覺得做老師有甚麼體會、得著,而你是深刻的 呢?

劉:我都教了十九年,每日都有很多事發生,又教了很多學生。很多事情都很深刻,要說也說不完。教書令我最深刻的,就是未必自己所教的學生都很聰明、很有才華,但是在教導的過程看到他們的成長和改變。有不少學生本來很頑皮,但看到他們慢慢長大,變得成熟,走上正途,這些可以說是教導學生的得著。

黃: 你由學生年代到現在的工作都是在聖貞德渡過,你 有沒有甚麼特別感覺?

劉:回到聖貞德,其實感到很親切。見到很多熟悉的人,校服又是那一套,沒有改變,校歌亦一樣。但亦有一些東西消失了,例如之前提過的會刊。

黃:你會不會覺得可惜?

劉:從感情上來說,當然覺得有些可惜。但從社會的進步、時代的改變來說,就覺得是理所當然。因為是慢慢看著它改變,所以衝擊也不太大。

55週年校慶專題──舊生專訪▶

訪問者:何禧鴻、黃俊文 被訪者:薛海暉老師

何: 你可否先介紹一下自己?

薛:我是2000年的中七畢業生,畢業後在香港教育學院修讀視 覺藝術教育,副修中文,但因為我很喜歡舞台劇,所以教育 學院畢業後,我便到演藝學院繼續進修,成為一個舞台劇演 員。

何:老師和舞台劇演員的性質差別很大,為何你會有這個決定呢?

薛:當我完成教育學院的課程後,發現藝術的領域原來很廣闊,再加上當時我遇到一位來自美國的教授,他讓我眼界大開,對藝術有了新的看法。那一年的暑假我參加了一個前往法國的視覺藝術教育交流團,看到很多不同的藝術表達方式,令我感受到藝術領域的遼闊。當時有一位在教育學院工作的「世外高人」,通知我在德國有一個五年才舉行一次的藝術展覽,機會難得,於是我趁機前往德國欣賞那個展覽,令我茅塞頓開。

而且我自己對舞台表演一直都很有興趣,到歐洲交流之後, 更讓我堅信藝術創作不可只停留在畫紙及顏料之中;人本身已是天主的創造,擁有美和善的特質,我希望自己能夠成為 藝術創作的原材料。因此我更要去豐富及充實自己,才能與 學生分享生命和藝術。最後我選擇了入讀香港演藝學院的戲 劇學院表演系。

何: 你的經歷很有趣呢!

薛:其實我覺得一切都是天主的奇妙安排,其實當年我獲得教育學院取錄前,演藝學院亦已經確認我的入學資格,但家人認為從事藝術工作對前途沒有保障,所以我決定先讀教育學院。雖然好像兜了一個圈,但是在教育學院學到的知識也對我從事藝術創作終身受用。

何: 為甚麼你會回來教宗教科呢?

薛:這就與何建儀老師有密切關係。因為是她鼓勵我在1999年 參加慕道班,並在2000年領洗,成為一個基督徒,她更成 為了我的「代母」。十一年之後,也是何建儀老師找我回來 教宗教科,二月時她說學校需要臨時多請一位宗教科老師, 問我可否回來幫忙,所以現在我便成了你們的宗教科老師。

何: 聽說你在宗教堂喜歡用活動教學法,為甚麼呢?

薛:因為我教宗教及倫理科嘛!我認為「感受」比「知識的傳授」更重要。現在中四的課題是「戀愛」,我不是要「告訴」你伴侶之間要互相尊重,因為說不定同學拍拖的經驗比我還要多。我要大家明白背後的真正意義——為何伴侶之間要互相尊重,所以我想用更多的方法去刺激大家思考!

何: 有沒有人引發你使用活動教學方法的呢?還是你自己想嘗試呢?與你以往的中學生活有沒有關係呢?

薛:其實教學方法有很多種,我不否定傳統的方法同樣可以有效 地教學。只是我認為宗教科不單止「知識的傳授」,有些事 情一定要大家身體力行才可以感受到。

説到跟聖貞德的關係……以往有一位宗教科老師名叫Mrs. C. Tan,她在我中六、七時教過我。作為老師,要培養學生的知識、技能和態度,而我在她身上看到她對培育「態度」上的執著。知識是硬資料,譬如,我跟你説:「你要努力讀書,那將來必定有一番成就。」你聽完之後可能會覺得沒有甚一特別,若你感到一件事的逼切性,你才會身體力行。

何: Mrs.C.Tan就是你當學生時,最喜歡的老師嗎?

薛:不只她一個,我跟廖志成老師、黃寶儀老師都很熟絡。今次 回到母校任教,見到很多熟悉的老師,我很感恩他們曾教導 我。因為沒有他們,也沒有今天的我,所以我回來任教,也 有一點報恩的心態。

何: 可否和我們介紹一下以前的宗教室?

薛:以前宗教室是你想像不到的。鋪滿磁磚和紙皮石,就好似 洗手間那一種,一格一格,沒有現在的漂亮,因為那兒原 本是禮堂的化妝室,所以真的設了一個洗手間。禮堂的另 一邊還有一個化妝室,那時用作學生會室。

何: 馮老師, 你是畢業於聖貞德小學嗎?

馮: 我不是聖貞德小學畢業, 我是被派位到聖貞德中 學的。我是八十年代的畢業生。

何: 你可以和我們談談當年聖貞德的情況嗎?當年羅 便臣道的學習生活是如何呢?

蘇:徐老師,感謝你在百忙之中抽空接 受訪問。請問你是在哪一年自聖貞德 中學畢業的?

徐: 我是八十年代的畢業生。

Once again students from our school took part in the annual Hong Kong Diocesan Schools' Educational Study Tour to New Zealand. The tour consisted of 105 students from Diocesan Catholic schools across the territory.

Interview with Mr. Li.

It has been 8 years since Mr. Li graduated from our school. Five years ago, he came back as an English teacher. Keaton: What do you think is the difference between your classmates then and your students now?
