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Student Rules and Regulations

<u>Rules</u>

- 1 Students must observe all school rules and regulations.
- 2 Students must have their student identity card and student handbook when at school.
- 3 Students must arrive at school punctually. No student should be late or leave school early without following the early leave procedures. Playing truant is strictly forbidden. If a student plays truant for 7 school days or more, he/she will be regarded as giving up his/her place at school.
- 4 Students must wear school uniform. They should keep a tidy and neat appearance at all times.
- 5 Students must respect and obey teachers, be kind and friendly to their classmates and cooperate with all school personnel.
- 6 Students must respect and support prefects and monitors by cooperating with them.
- 7 Students must take good care of school property and keep the school environment clean and tidy.
- 8 Students must take good care of their personal belongings.
- 9 Students must remain quiet and keep the classrooms clean.
- 10 When students have lessons in special rooms, they must observe the rules of the special rooms.
- 11 Students should only play ball games in designated places.
- 12 No student can carry out any activity using the school's name without the permission of the Principal.
- **13** The school reserves the right to explain or amend any school rule or regulation when necessary.
- 14 Without the consent of the school, no student is allowed to use his/her mobile phone within the school premises.

Morning assemblies, end of school day and school opening hours

- 1. Students must arrive at the school by 8.30 a.m. Otherwise, they will be considered late.
- 2. Students must assemble in the school playground at 8.30 a.m. to have the morning assembly.
- 3. All students must line up properly in the designated places.
- 4. Students should show respect during morning assembly by paying attention and not doing other things such as reading and talking.
- 5. After the morning assembly, students should proceed to the classroom in an orderly manner.
- 6. If the morning assembly is cancelled because of bad weather, students should stay inside the classroom for the morning assembly by 8.30 a.m.
- 7. Students must return to school by 1.40 p.m. after lunch. Otherwise, they will be considered late.
- 8. The opening hours of the school are from 7.15 a.m. to 5.30 p.m., except on special occasions. Students must wait at the tuck shop from 7:15 a.m. to 7:45 a.m. Students are allowed to return to their classroom after 7:45 a.m.

Notes for going to school

- 1. Any student who is late should give a detailed and accurate account about his/ her lateness as instructed. He/ She should also observe the rules and regulations about lateness accordingly.
- 2. Students who return to school for extra lessons or activities should wear proper school uniform and bring their student I.D. cards. If the activities involve ball games, students can change into their sports gear, which should be plain and simple in style, at school.
- **3.** Other than normal school hours or activities being led by teachers, students must leave the school once instructions have been given by office staff or teachers.
- 4. Students should keep all facilities clean and tidy after using them.
- 5. Students should not invite other people to enter the school without prior permission.

Politeness and good behavior

- 1. Students must be polite and courteous to all visitors, the School Supervisor, the Principal, teachers, staff and fellow schoolmates.
- 2. When teachers and visitors enter and leave the classroom, students must show respect by greeting or thanking them in an appropriate manner.
- **3.** Students should first knock on the door to seek permission before entering a room to speak to the School Supervisor, the Principal or teachers.
- 4. During lesson time, students must seek permission from the teachers before entering or leaving the classroom.
- 5. During lesson time, running, talking or playing in the corridor and stairways are prohibited.
- 6. Students must raise their hands to ask or answer teacher's questions.
- 7. Students must sit properly.
- 8. When changing lessons, students must keep quiet and remain in their seats in the classroom.
- **9.** When teachers are carrying a lot of things, students should take the initiative to offer help.
- **10.** Senior Form students should be role models to junior Form students. They should help and care for junior Form students.
- **11.** Students must not use foul language at all times.
- **12.** Students should be honest.
- **13.** Students should behave themselves and be polite both at school and outside school.

Keeping school campus clean / classroom rules

- **1.** Students must keep the walls clean.
- 2. Students must keep the desks and chairs tidy.
- 3. Students must not write on the blackboard without permission.
- 4. Students must not run, shout or play ball games in the classroom.
- 5. Students must eat at the designated areas on campus.

Caring for personal belongings and school property

- **1.** Students are cautioned not to bring a large amount of money or other valuables to school.
- **2.** Without permission, students must not bring non-academic materials and books to school.
- **3.** Without teachers' permission, students must not put their personal belongings in the classroom after school.
- 4. If students find things which do not belong to them or look suspicious, they should inform the school at once. If students lose something in school, they should inform the school at once.
- 5. Students should register before using the school phone.
- **6.** Students are not allowed to move school equipment or damage school facilities.
- 7. Students should close all the windows and door before leaving the classroom especially at windy times during the year.
- **8.** Students should report to teachers at once if any school property has been damaged.

Dress code

Boys

Hair: Hair style should be simple and tidy, cut above the ears. Hair is to be clear of the eyes. Hair is not below the collar of the shirt.

Summer: short-sleeved shirt with school badge

light-blue striped trousers with black or dark-brown belt white socks

Winter: black school jacket or fleece with school badge long-sleeved white shirt with school badge school tie grey winter trousers with black or dark-brown belt

white socks

Girls

Hair: Hair style should be neat, clean and clear of the eyes. If the length of hair reaches the shirt collar, girls must tie their hair neatly in a ponytail. The fringe should not hang over the eyes. Only plain black hair pins are permitted.

Junior:

Summer: light-blue striped dress, long enough to cover the knees school pin worn on the tie white socks

Winter: black school jacket or fleece with school badge grey woolen dress, long enough to cover the knees long-sleeved white shirt school tie white socks

Senior:

Summer: short-sleeved shirt with school badge

light-blue striped skirt, long enough to cover the knees, with a black or dark-brown belt

Winter: black school jacket or fleece with school badge

grey woolen skirt, long enough to cover the knees, with black or dark-brown belt long-sleeved white shirt with school badge school tie white socks

- 1. Students are expected to keep themselves well-groomed and neatly dressed at all times.
- 2. Wearing plain white underwear. Dark-brown leather shoes are to be worn.
- **3.** Students can wear a plain grey, black or dark-blue scarf. A grey woolen jersey or cardigan is allowed with a school pin throughout the year.
- **4.** Students are not allowed to use make-up. No hair dyeing, nail polish, earring, lipstick or any kind of accessories are allowed.
- 5. PE uniform together with sport shoes are to be worn during PE lessons.
- **6.** School sports team uniforms should only be worn during training time. They cannot be worn as a replacement for the PE uniform.
- 7. Students will be informed of the dress code for non-teaching days or other occasions.
- 8. If the Hong Kong Observatory issues the cold weather warning at 6.00 am, students may wear <u>a plain black</u>, <u>dark blue or grey down jacket</u> to school (Uniforms or sweatshirts of students' societies are not allowed). Girls may wear plain black or plain white stockings.

Lateness, early leave, truancy and school withdrawal

- 1 The school rules and regulations should be observed in handling lateness. For details, please refer to `Procedures in handling cases of serious lateness, improper uniform wear, untidiness and misbehavior.
- 2 Those who are late in entering classrooms for lessons and who have no proper explanation will be regarded as playing truant.
- 3 Any student who needs to leave early must fill in a form which is obtainable from the school office. The form must be signed by the class teacher before informing the parent concerned. Only with the permission of the parent can the student be allowed to leave school.
- 4 In the examination period, students should follow the school time-table to go to school, except for examinations of subjects with special arrangements.
- 5 Any student who wishes to withdraw from school should inform the school by handing in a formal letter written by his / her parent.

Application for absence

- **1.** If a student fails to return to school due to illness, parents should call the school office before 8:00 a.m.
- 2. When a student returns to school after recovering from illness, a leave application letter must be submitted to the form teacher within three school days.
- **3.** For sick leave of three days or more, a leave application letter and a doctor's certificate letter must be submitted. If the leave procedure is not complete, it will be regarded as absenteeism.
- **4.** If a student is absent during the exam period, he/she has to hand in a medical certificate and parent's letter within one week. If a medical certificate cannot be produced, the absentee will be treated as unauthorized absence and a "zero" mark will be given for any examinations held on that day.

- 5. Students are advised to refrain from applying for personal leave during the exam period.
- 6. For follow-up consultation and personal leave applications, a leave application letter must be submitted to the form teacher three days in advance. Parents can download the "Application for Leave of Absence" from the school website.
- **7.** The school will inform the Education Bureau if a student plays truant for 7 days or more.
- **8.** Failing to follow the full procedures for being absent, a student's absence will be treated as truancy.

Academic

- **1.** Students should concentrate in lessons and bring all the required textbooks and materials.
- 2 Apart from the homework assigned by teachers, students are expected to prepare for lessons, take notes, do revision and read extensively for fostering their studies and language proficiency.
- 3 Teachers will distribute assignments through Google Classroom. Parents may refer to their children's Google Classroom for records of assignments.
- 4. Students should complete their homework, both electric and printed, on their own and submit it before the deadline. Plagiarism is highly discouraged and follow-up action will be taken.

Using Information Technology facilities at school

- **1.** Without permission, students should not login to the school network or use any IT facilities at school.
- **2.** Students are responsible to take care of their personal passwords and not release it to anyone.
- **3.** Students must not receive, deliver, or save any illegal materials or materials violating school rules.
- **4.** Using another person's computer or using a computer to commit a crime is a criminal offence and results in serious consequences.

Others

- **1.** Students are not allowed to enter the staffroom and common room.
- 2. Smoking, gambling and drinking alcoholic drinks are strictly prohibited.
- **3.** Students are allowed to enter special rooms with permission from teacher(s).
- 4. Students can only enter other classrooms with permission from teacher(s).

Purchasing a school tie, school badge or exercise book

1. Students can purchase a school tie, school badge or exercise book at the office during recess and lunch time every Monday and Thursday.

Paying fees

1. The Education Bureau has implemented 12 years free education. As a result, students do not need to pay school fees. Only Forms 4 to 6 students are required to pay Tong Fai at the beginning of the academic year.

- **2.** Miscellaneous fees will only be collected once at the beginning of the academic year.
- **3.** For those who apply for the School Textbook Assistance scheme, the paid fee will be refunded once the application is successful.
- 4. It is advisable that all payments made to the school should be paid by ePayment.Parents can inform the school if they would like to settle payments by cheque payable to "The IMC of St Joan of Arc Secondary School".

<u>The School Textbook Assistance scheme and The Student Travel Subsidy</u> (STS) Scheme

Students can attain the application forms from their Form masters in late May. They can hand in the form directly to the Student Finance Office. Successful applicants will have the money transferred to their bank accounts.

Lunch

- 1. Form 1 to 3 students are required to stay at school for lunch during lunch time. Students can order lunch provided by the assigned caterer or bring their own lunch.
- 2. Students must not buy food from unlicensed providers.

<u>School leaving certificate, Testimonials, Academic Transcript and</u> <u>recommendation letters</u>

If students want a copy of their school leaving certificate, an academic transcript or a recommendation letter from the school, they should apply in writing 5 days in advance.

BYOD - Bring Your Own Device Acceptable Use Policy (AUP) for students

Definition:

Devices refer to iPads, tablets or notebook computers but do not include mobile phones.

Principles:

1. Students can use their devices for educational purposes only.

2. Students can only use their devices during lesson time with teachers' prior permission.

Guidelines:

- 1. When students use electronic devices for learning, they must lay their electronic devices flat on their desk.
- 2. Students should not use their devices for non-educational purposes.
- Students are prohibited to use their devices for entertainment purposes. (e.g. playing games, listening to music or watching videos)
- Students are not allowed to use/ access any social-networking websites. (e.g. Facebook, Instagram, Snapchat, etc.)
- Students are not allowed to use any instant messaging applications. (e.g. WhatsApp, WeChat, Line, Telegram, etc.)
- 3. Students are not allowed to use earphones without teachers' permission.
- 4. Students are prohibited from photo-taking or video/voice recording on school campus without their teachers' prior permission.
- 5. Students can only listen to audio files with teachers' permission. The volume should be kept at a level that does not disrupt others.
- 6. Students are responsible for the charging of the battery of their devices. They are not allowed to charge their devices in their classrooms.
- 7. Students should take good care of their personal devices and put them into their lockers if needed. They should stick labels with their names to the back of their devices. The school is not liable for any loss, damage or thievery of devices brought to school.
- 8. Our school will install applications on devices with MDM. All other downloaded and installed must comply with copyright laws.
- 9. Students having installed MDM should never share the Wi-Fi password with others, both inside and outside school.
- 10. Students who do not observe the guidelines for three times will receive one bad mark.

In serious cases of breach of discipline, lesson or school suspensions may be imposed.

Punishment for lateness:

1 The school rules and regulations should be observed in handling lateness. Any student who is late for the second time will receive a warning letter and be expected to attend the detention class. His/ Her parents will also be informed. If the student continues to arrive at school late, he/she will have to attend the

detention class each time he/she is late. A bad mark will be issued to the student if he/she is late for the third time. Thereafter, for every 3 times of lateness, a student will receive a bad mark. For further information please refer to `Procedures in handling cases of serious lateness, improper uniform wear, untidiness and misbehavior'.

2 The school will keep a student's lateness record for the whole academic year.

Punishment for improper school uniform and untidiness:

- 1 A record of students who do not wear proper school uniform or who are untidy will be kept. A warning letter will be issued to a student who has not complied with the school rules 5 times. Students who have not complied with the rules 10 times will be given a bad mark. If the student continues to not comply with the rules after receiving a bad mark for the first time, the student will receive another bad mark for every 5 times he/she does not comply with the rules.
- 2 The school will handle all cases according to the school rules and regulations.

1. Procedures in handling cases of serious lateness, improper uniform wear, untidiness and misbehavior:

Students need to attend the detention class due to serious lateness, improper uniform, untidiness and misbehavior.

- i Serious lateness/ Multiple times of lateness Students need to attend the detention class under any of the following circumstances:
- If they are late for both the morning and afternoon session.
- If they arrive at school after 9:15 a.m.
- If they have a late record for more than 2 times.
- ii Improper uniform, untidiness and misbehavior

Students will have to attend detention class if they are found to have 2 uniform, untidiness or misbehavior records by the Students Affairs teachers.

2. The procedure of detention:

The parents of the student will be notified by eNotice once the student is required to attend the detention class. Students will receive a detention notification slip which indicates the time and venue clearly.

3. The procedure of not attending the detention class:

If a student is absent from the detention class without proper permission, he/she will be given 2 bad marks.

4. If a student is late many times, the school may suspend him from attending classes after looking into the matter.

4 If a student misbehaves in class, the teacher will record his/ her name and inform the parents. The procedure is as follows:

- 5 The record of misbehavior will be given to the class teacher every 2 weeks, and the class teacher will follow up with the subject teacher(s).
- 6 If the student continues to misbehave after punishment, the teacher concerned will inform the parent and follow up the case with the Student Affairs Committee.

Academic Affairs

1. Summative Assessment

One uniform test and one examination will take place in each school term to assess students' learning. Please refer to the school calendar for details.

- 2. Continuous Assessment A diversified mode of assessment is adopted to evaluate students' performance in terms of their knowledge, skills and attitudes. It includes quizzes, projects, book reports, learning portfolios and lesson participation record, etc.
- 3. Mark Allocation

In order to encourage students to actively engage in learning throughout the year, 20% of the subject mark is allocated to continuous assessment. 20% of the subject mark is allocated to tests and 60% to examinations. The passing mark for S1 to S3 is 50% of the subject mark and the passing mark for S4 to S6 is 40% of the subject mark.

4. School-based Assessment (SBA)

School-based assessment is a core part of the Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education Examination (HKDSE). S4 to S6 students are expected to complete the tasks assigned by teachers. Late submission will result in mark deduction. Students who fail to submit their work will get a zero mark in the SBA component. Measures ensuring fairness and standardization will be adopted. Students who are dissatisfied with the scores awarded should report to the subject teachers concerned.

- 5. Enhancement Programmes for Languages and Core Subjects The following programmes are organized to consolidate students' learning.
 - S1 summer bridging programme
 - Enhancement and remedial programmes
 - Small class teaching
 - HKDSE seminars
- 6. Awards and Punishment
- 1) Wiser King Award Scheme Students who perform well in quizzes, tests and examinations will be awarded.
- 2) Students who have a poor learning attitude or frequently fail to submit homework will be sent to detention or given disciplinary action.
